Group management	The Farm Manager must be advised of all upcoming group visits, to ensure that farm activities are planned accordingly (e.g. no machinery or equipment which could pose a hazard to be used in the vicinity of the school group; areas unsafe are excluded from the tour path). Members of the group should remain together. In the event a member of the group must leave the group, the tour guide or person responsible for the group must be notified.  Where necessary (for large groups) and practical, a responsible adult will follow behind the group to ensure the group stays together. On judgement of the guide or person responsible, additional risk controls may be applied for the group's activity to suit the conditions of the day.

Snake bite		<ul> <li>Staying together as a group with tour guide</li> <li>All workers to wear sturdy, enclosed shoes.</li> <li>At induction, visitors advised of the presence of snakes on site and to immediately tell a staff member if they see one</li> <li>When a snake is sighted, all persons present to be notified that one (or more) has been seen and its location.</li> </ul>	Low

	Bee or other insect stings (e.g. wasp, spiders, ticks, mosquitoes)	<ul> <li>Visitors advised of the presence of bees on site as part of the farm induction and asked to declare if they are allergic or anaphylactic. Those who are anaphylactic are asked to present their EpiPen, as well as keep clear of the beehives</li> <li>No visitors to handle bees, beehives or other insects. They will remain 10m or more from the beehives to best avoid being stung</li> <li>Visitors are advised to bring personal supply of insect repellent and know how to apply it, if they are concerned about insects</li> </ul>	Medium
	Potential exposure to Asbestos debris	Visitors advised that bonded asbestos has previously been found on site and to alert a staff member if building materials are spotted anywhere on site	Low
	Injury from tools or machinery	<ul> <li>Scheduling site works – Farm Manager to be aware of tours on site including partner visits.</li> <li>No one to go within five (5) metres of anyone using tools or machinery</li> <li>Visitors advised that there are tools and machinery on site, and they are not to touch them without express permission from a staff member</li> </ul>	Low
Visiting the Minor electric shock from fencing		<ul> <li>Visitors advised that there is white or orange electrical tape around some animal enclosures and not to touch it to avoid getting a shock</li> <li>Farm staff to turn electric fencing off before visitors arrive where possible</li> <li>Groups to stay one metre or further from electrical tape always</li> </ul>	Low
	Threats to Animal welfare  - leading to animal  disturbances, charging or	<ul> <li>Visitor groups will be advised to behave in a quiet, calm and respectful way near any animals to prevent animals from being stressed or frightened</li> <li>Handling animals - Visitors advised to not to touch any animals and only with permission. Visitors must not attempt to pick up any animals on the farm at any time without</li> </ul>	Medium
	bites, feed issues	<ul> <li>permission</li> <li>Feeding animals is at their own risk and only with permission. 		First aid kit available within the farm hub and trained first aiders available on site	
	Cut or sting from a plant e.g. stinging nettle	<ul> <li>Farm plant management and pruning practices</li> <li>At induction, visitors are briefed on the risks of touching and handling plants with prickles, spikes, thorns or other sharp protrusions. Low-hanging branches pose a risk to scratching faces and eyes, so visitors are asked to avoid those areas.</li> <li>Stinging nettles are found on site and areas of concern will be identified by the supervisor.</li> <li>Visitors advised not to pick or tear any plant unless otherwise permitted.</li> </ul>	Low
	Nut allergies Asthma	<ul> <li>Tree and other nuts are present on the farm e.g. peanuts. Guide to know where these are and to discourage visitors from touching them.</li> <li>Nuts found on the ground are not to be picked up.</li> </ul>	Low
Tasting edibles  On the farm  tasting of products on the farm  Choking		<ul> <li>Visitors advised of various types of edibles that may be tasted on site as part of the farm induction and asked to declare if they are allergic or anaphylactic. Those who are anaphylactic are asked to present their EpiPen, as well as not to taste anything in the related families of allergies (Bee allergies – No honey, Berry allergies – No Mulberries etc)</li> <li>Tour guides all to be first-aid trained, young children tasting offered under adult supervision.</li> </ul>	Low
Other	Poor student behaviour that compromises safety	<ul> <li>Students and participants to be briefed on expected quality of behaviour</li> <li>Measures in place for dangerously disruptive students and participants to be escorted and separated by other staff from visiting school/group</li> <li>Risk taking or dangerous behaviour must be reported to farm manager. Visitor may be banned from re-entering the site.</li> </ul>	Low
	Heat exhaustion, dehydration, sunburn	<ul> <li>Shaded areas are used for group standing and activity where possible.</li> <li>All students, participants and staff are required to wear hats, protective clothing and closed footwear when participating in lessons and activities.</li> <li>All visitors, students and participants are required to bring at least one 600ml bottle of water.</li> <li>Sunscreen is available onsite.</li> </ul>	Low
